Safe Routes to School Project Finally Sees Major Progress



The first phase of the Safe Routes to School sidewalk replacement project is nearing completion. Councilwoman Anne Rust Aurand is pleased to report that both the aesthetics and the functionality of the sidewalks on Jennings have greatly improved.

The photo above shows part of the old sidewalks in the tearing-out phase. Not only were they crumbling and dangerous, they were also out of compliance with the current standards of the Americans with Disabilities Act, Title II.

The new sidewalks (below) are designed to accommodate pedestrians of all levels of mobility. Some sections will be poured wider than they had previously been which will provide greater ease of use. Pedestrians will no longer have to avoid utility poles and other obstructions as they enjoy beautiful Downtown Historic Newburgh.

State Street will receive the next round of construction as the crews move around the corner to begin the second phase of this project. Again, we thank you for your continued patience during these improvements.



Trail-Side Restroom Signs

The Rivertown Trail has several restrooms available for use during warmer months. Unfortunately the facilities are not temperature controlled.

New signs installed on restroom doors will indicate when they are closed for the season. To prevent pipes from bursting in below freezing temperatures, the water to these facilities will be turned off for the winter.

As soon as the risk of freezing has passed, the signs will be removed and the restrooms will be opened for the season.

New Fire Truck

Newburgh's newest fire truck is currently being constructed. Equipment has been specifically selected to meet Newburgh's needs and is being fitted and installed at this time.

Fire Commissioner Alonzo Moore is certain Newburgh's residents will greatly benefit from a new, safe, and compliant pumper truck.

Sewer Repairs

Rivertown Trail Usage Policy

The Rivertown Trail Committee has been working diligently to create a usage policy to help regulate event traffic and group-use expectations.

Council members Bill Kavanaugh and Tonya McGuire, who serve on the Rivertown Trail Committee, agree that it has been difficult to set standards of use for groups that wish to hold events on the trail since a policy has never before been implemented.

The growing popularity of the Rivertown Trail will create more frequent need for repairs and maintenance. By registering each event, the Town is permitted to enforce event parking, clean-up, and damage control standards, as well as many other issues.

Snow Removal Procedures

The Newburgh Street Department follows the below outline to clear Newburgh's roadways.

- 1) Plow major snow routes so emergency vehicles can get through
- 2) Plow secondary streets
- 3) Start salting all hills and intersections
- 4) Widen plowed roads to full street capacity
- 5) Allow traffic to spread the salt and sand

Please be aware that the plow blade may leave a ridge of snow in areas that might slightly inconvenience residents. Unfortunately sometimes blocking-in driveways and cars cannot be avoided. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we keep your roads safe.

Sign Ordinance Reminder

The Town of Newburgh boasts a refined and uncluttered appearance thanks to Sign Ordinance 2006-11. This ordinance governs things such as the materials, placement, and size of all types of signs including election signs, garage sale signs, and commercial signs, to name a few.

Campaign and election related signs must be removed within 7 days after the election, so please be sure to take care of any such signs by Tuesday, November 11, 2014.
